



WORLD CANCER DAY

Cancer is the second leading cause of death both in the world and in our country. When we look at the causes of death, it is seen that approximately one out of every 6 deaths in the world and one out of every 5 deaths in our country is due to cancer.

The World Cancer Day events, which were first organized by the International Organization for Cancer Control (UICC), with which our country is in close cooperation, in 2005, became traditional with the campaigns carried out at the global level with UICC and its cooperating organizations on February 4 of each year in the following years.

In our country, within the scope of the National Cancer Control Program, which combines registration, prevention, screening and treatment studies since 2008 in line with WHO recommendations; Screening programs are carried out for breast, colon and cervical cancers in accordance with the resources and disease burden of the society.


OPENCOURSEWARE

AUTHOR OF THE MONTH



STEFAN ZWEIG

(NOVEMBER 28, 1881 - FEBRUARY 23, 1942)

Born in Vienna, Austria in 1881, Stefan Zweig is a playwright, novelist, journalist and biographer. Stefan, whose father is a wealthy industrialist, has been well-educated in literature and culture from an early age and speaks Latin, French, English and Greek fluently.

He wrote his first poems in high school. He worked as an archive officer at the war headquarters in Vienna voluntarily during World War I, returned to Austria after the war ended, settled in Salzburg and married Frederike Von Winternit.

He stayed here for about 20 years, and the years he spent were the most productive. He made good friendships with people. During his last years in Salzburg, Stefan Zweig put his weight on the intellectual unity of Europe and constantly warned against extremism with a number of conferences and articles. Known for being very productive, Zweig wrote lyric poems, experimented with stage works in the genre of tragedy and biography.

"The person who has once found himself has nothing to lose on this earth anymore. And he understands all people who have once understood the man in himself."






