



All research outputs published with the address of Istinye University must be archived in the University's Institutional Academic Archive. Thus, the data of all studies belonging to the University will be accessible within the framework of copyright. Encourages researchers to actively inform about research results and inform the public about them. Encourages publishing research outputs in open access peer-reviewed journals with high impact value. Publishing the studies and research results of research groups conducted with the address of Istinye University on an open access basis increases the reliability and reproducibility of the studies as well as increased scientific communication among researchers. In addition, these academic outputs contribute to the researches carried out in different projects to reach results in a shorter time thanks to open science.

## Suna Kan's Life

(October 21, 1936 - June 11, 2023)

A "child prodigy" whose talent is identified at an early age as one of the best violin virtuosos in Turkey was recognized; for many years he was a member of the Presidential Symphony Orchestra. She worked as a soloist and concertmaster. She has held the title of "state artist" since 1971.

She was born in Adana, Suna Kan took her first violin lessons from her father Nuri Kan when he was five years old. Also Walter Gerhardt, Gilbert Back, He studied with İzzet Nezihi Albayrak and Lico Almar. She performed Mozart's 5th Violin Concerto at her first concert, she was only nine years old. In 1948 İdil Biret and Suna Kan were recognized under the law on child prodigy. She was sent to Paris.



She graduated from the conservatory, where she studied as a student of Gabriel Bouillon, with the first prize in 1952. Suna Kan won first prize at the Geneva International Competition in 1954, second prize at the Viotti International Competition in 1955 and second prize at the Munich International Competition in 1956. In 1957, he received the Paris City Prize at the M. Long - J. Thibaud International Competition. For many years, he worked as concertmaster and soloist in the Presidential Symphony Orchestra and the Ankara Chamber Orchestra, of which he was one of the founders.

Suna Kan, who adopted the principle of including a wide repertoire of contemporary violin literature and especially the works of Turkish composers in her programs, was honored with the title of State Artist in 1971 for her contribution to Turkish art and outstanding services. Kan, who has toured extensively abroad and performed in almost all continents, has given concerts in England, France, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Belgium, Holland, Sweden, Norway, Russia, China, Japan, Canada, the USA and South America. The orchestras accompanying our artist, who interprets concertos with high-level orchestras, can be listed as follows: London Symphony, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Bamberg Symphony, Moscow Symphony, French National Radio Symphony. Istvan Kertesz, Walter Susskind, Zubin Mehta, Hans Rosbaud, Louis Fremaux, Gotthold Lessing, Michel Plasson, Yehudi Menuhin, Igor Bezrodni, Pierre Fournier, Andre Navarra, Frederick Riddle are among the famous conductors who accompanied the artist with the orchestras he conducted.

In 1996, the artist was awarded the Gold Medal of Honor from the Sevda - Cenap And Music Foundation. In 1997, Müşerref Hekimoğlu wrote "Suna Kan: The Violin That Hears Its Own Song" was published by the Sevda - Cenap And Music Foundation.

Suna Kan died on June 11, 2023.






Prof. Dr. Hatice Gülen also informed the participants about the IFLA Green Library Poster study conducted within the scope of Istinye University sustainability studies.

#### SAİT FAİK ABASIYANIK

November 18, 1906 - May 11, 1954

Turkish short story and novel writer, poet. One of the leading writers of Turkish storytelling, Sait Faik is considered one of the cornerstones of Turkish literature for his contributions to contemporary storytelling.

A museum named after Sait Faik Abasiyanik was opened in Burgazada on August 22, 1959. In the museum, the author's belongings, photographs, letters, postcards, and many other items and documents that bear the traces of his countless memories that are the subject of his works meet with visitors.


The museum house, which takes its readers on a fascinating journey through Sait Faik's literary and spiritual world, serves free of charge in accordance with the author's will.

Sir Thomas More is one of the rare people who has the honor of being compared to Socrates. His immortal work Utopia has become a world classic and is still widely read today. Utopia, written almost five hundred years ago, is dominated by Humanism in the broadest sense, that is, love and respect for humanity.

A state founded by ordinary people who do not consider anyone superior to anyone else: Thomas More's Utopia. A paradise on earth.

Thomas More was a 16th-century writer who distinguished himself throughout his judgeship for his honesty and fairness and, like Plato, was in a sense condemned to death for it. In Utopia (1516), published nearly five hundred years ago, More presents a "paradise on earth", so to speak, and an example of "social happiness" that is still cited today.






## Turkish Librarians Association (TKD) Code of Ethics

- 1. They defend the right of access to information, as enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, other international conventions and the TKD Declaration on Freedom of Thought, for all members of society and strive to fulfill its requirements.
- 2. They oppose censorship of intellectual and artistic works and defend freedom of thought.
- 3. They treat users equally without any discrimination.
- 4. They make active efforts in the development and implementation of professional policies and standards.
- 5. They provide accurate and sufficient information in a timely manner and perform their duties in a way that adds value to the profession.
- 6. Respect and protect copyrights.
- 7. Guarantee the confidentiality of users' research, borrowed and/or utilized information sources, and do not share their personal information with anyone except when legally required.
- 8. They do not engage in discourses and behaviors that are not based on objective data and that may damage the reputation of professional staff, a professional group in general or an information center with unfair slander.
- 9. They do not gain personal benefit while fulfilling their professional duties and responsibilities.
- 10. Pay attention to professional cooperation and solidarity.
- 11. They are sensitive about their professional development, continuously improve themselves in this respect and reflect this to their services.
- 12. They act fairly and honestly in their professional and managerial relations.
