Dear Istinye University Family,






We Read in 81 Cities is in its 13th year!



AUTHOR OF THE MONTH

HIFZI TOPUZ



He was among the founders of the Istanbul Journalists' Union, which was established in 1952. Between 1947 and 1957, he published his articles and interviews in various newspapers and magazines. In 1957, he went to France for his education. He completed his master's degree at the International Journalism Training Center in Strasbourg. He then completed his doctorate at Strasbourg University Faculty of Law.

He taught courses such as political communication, international communication, history of radio and television at Anadolu University Faculty of Communication and then at Istanbul University Faculty of Communication upon the suggestion of Niyazi Öktem. In 1986, the author founded the Association for Communication Research, known as ILAD. In the late nineties, the author started writing novels and continued his writing activities largely on this axis.

Hıfzı Topuz started his writing career in the 1940s. However, he did not write novels or stories until the 1990s. Until the 1990s, he mostly wrote reviews and research articles. His first writings between 1947 and 1957 were published in newspapers such as Akşam, Vatan, Öncü, Cumhuriyet and Milliyet.


Hıfzı Topuz is a member of organizations such as the Writers' Union of Turkey, PEN, Writers' Association, Press Ethics Council and Communication Research Association: Sertel Democracy Award (1998), Association of Journalists of Turkey Press Freedom Award (2003), Federation of Lions Clubs Atatürk Peace Award (2004), Osmangazi University Honorary Doctorate Award (2005), Orhan Kemal Novel Award for Başın Öne Eğilmesin (2007), 50th Anniversary Award of the International Communication Research Association given by UNESCO (2007), Yeni Künne Eğilmesin (2007). Year Award given by UNESCO (2007), Enlightenment Honor Award given by the Association of New Generation Village Institutes (2012), Lubumbashi Faculty of Communication Honorary Doctorate Award given in Congo (2018), Middle East Technical University Cultural Service Honor Award (2014), Galatasaray Association Honorary Award (2014).

LIBRARIAN SUGGESTS

MUSEUM ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM

Istanbul Archaeological Museums is a complex of museums consisting of three main units. The Archaeological Museum, the Museum of Ancient Oriental Art and the Tiled Pavilion Museum. The Istanbul Archaeological Museums, Turkey's first museum, has nearly one million artefacts from various cultures brought from the lands of the empire.

The interest in collecting historical artefacts in the Ottoman Empire dates back to the reign of Sultan Mehmet the Conqueror, but the institutionalisation of museology coincides with the establishment of the Istanbul Archaeological Museums in 1869 as the 'Museum-i Hümayun', the Imperial Museum. The Museum-I Humayun, consisting of archaeological artefacts collected in Hagia Irene Church until that day, forms the basis of the Istanbul Archaeological Museums. When Hagia Irene became insufficient, the 'Tiled Pavilion' built during the reign of Sultan Mehmet the Conqueror was converted into a museum. The Tiled Pavilion, which is still affiliated to the Istanbul Archaeological Museums, was restored and opened to visitors in 1880.

In 1881, with the appointment of Osman Hamdi Bey as the director of the museum, a new era in Turkish museology begins. Osman Hamdi Bey carried out excavations at Nemrud Mountain, Myrina, Kyme and other Aeolian necropolises and the Temple of Hecate in Lagina, and as a result of his excavations in Sidon (Sidon) between 1887 and 1888, he reached the Sidon King Necropolis and returned to Istanbul with many sarcophagi, especially the world-famous Sarcophagus of Alexander.

The oldest building in the Istanbul Archaeological Museums complex (1472 AD) is the Tiled Pavilion. The free Pavilion Museum, where examples of Turkish tiles and ceramics are currently exhibited, is one of the oldest examples of Ottoman civil architecture in Istanbul.

The building, which is used as the Museum of Ancient Oriental Art, was built by Osman Hamdi Bey in 1883 as the Sanayi-i Nefise Mektebi, the Academy of Fine Arts. The architect of the building was Atexander Vallaury, who would later build the Classical building of Istanbul Archaeological Museums. In 1917, when the academy moved to Cağaloğlu, this building was allocated to the directorate of museums

The Archaeological Museum stands out as one of the rare buildings built as a conseum building in the world for its period. It is one of the most beautiful and magnificent examples of Neo-Classical architecture in Istanbul. The Ottoman inscription on the pediment reads 'Asar-I Atika Museum' (Museum of Antiquores). The tughra above the inscription belongs to Sultan II. Abdülhamid belongs to Sultan Abdülhamid.

Between 1887 and 1888, a new museum building was needed to exhibit the magnificent artefacts brought to Istanbul from the Sidon King Necropolis Excavations carried out by Osman Hamdi Bey, including the Sarcophagus of Alexander, the Sarcophagus of Weeping Women, the Lycian Sarcophagus, and the Tabnit Sarcophagus, and the classical building of the Istanbul Archaeological Museums, built by the famous architect of the period Alexander Vallaury opposite the Tiled Pavilion, was opened to visitors on 13 June 1891.

The halls numbered 1, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 on the lower floor and all of the halls on the upper floor in the buildings of the Istanbul Archaeological Museums Directorate; "Assos Exhibition Hall" on the ground floor of the Annex Building and "Istanbul's Environmental Cultures: Thrace, Bithynia - Byzantium" exhibition halls are closed to visitors.

The History of Ideas, the product of Peter Watson's enormous research, is a comprehensive account of human history, of human creativity.

Beginning with the invention of the flint axe two million years ago, this history tells the stories not of emperors and kings, ministers and generals, but of ideas, the cornerstones of humanity's long run. The first languages, the first words, gods, sacrifices, the calendar, time, art, money, writing and economy are distilled from the life stories of inventors, philosophers, musicians, religious leaders, poets and writers.

Written as an alternative to traditional history, this book is not a history of kings, wars, conquests and treaties, but a bedside reference that presents the thought processes behind all the great events recorded in history, and the history of the ideas and inventions that are the products of these processes. The aim of the book, which is presented under five main headings, is, in the words of the author, "to identify and analyse the ideas and inventions that have had a long-term impact on the way we live and think in the past or the present."


A first step towards understanding ourselves and the world we live in, History of Ideas also helps those who wish to continue on their way with its rich bibliography.

Turkish Librarians Association (TKD) Code of Ethics

- 1. They defend the right of access to information, as enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, other international conventions and the TKD Declaration on Freedom of Thought, for all members of society and strive to fulfill its requirements.
- 2. They oppose censorship of intellectual and artistic works and defend freedom of thought.
- 3. They treat users equally without any discrimination.
- 4. They make active efforts in the development and implementation of professional policies and standards.
- 5. They provide accurate and sufficient information in a timely manner and perform their duties in a way that adds value to the profession.
- 6. Respect and protect copyrights.
- 7. Guarantee the confidentiality of users' research, borrowed and/or utilized information sources, and do not share their personal information with anyone except when legally required.
- 8. They do not engage in discourses and behaviors that are not based on objective data and that may damage the reputation of professional staff, a professional group in general or an information center with unfair slander.
- 9. They do not gain personal benefit while fulfilling their professional duties and responsibilities.
- 10. Pay attention to professional cooperation and solidarity.
- 11. They are sensitive about their professional development, continuously improve themselves in this respect and reflect this to their services.
- 12. They act fairly and honestly in their professional and managerial relations.
